Geraldine Anna Seliga Wilson went to be with her Lord on September 24, 2020 at the age of 94. She was born June 13, 1926 to Anna and John B. Seliga in Detroit, Michigan.

In January, 1946 she married Joseph L. Wilson and they had four children: Ann Marie Brattain (William), Carole Jo Simpkins, (deceased), Mark A. Wilson and Gail E. Hahn. Her grandchildren are Amy. G. Lombardo, William A. Brattain, and Charles A. Hahn and her great-granddaughter is Skylar M. Lombardo.

During her lifetime Gerry was very proud of her accomplishments. She was an accomplished soloist, and was choir director of three United Methodist Churches both in Michigan and Winter Haven, FL. She attended Polk Junior College and on her fifty-second birthday she graduated with an Associate of Science degree and became a Certified Professional Secretary. She worked for various State of Florida agencies and retired from the Florida Department of Citrus.

Gerry established the Beymer Memorial United Methodist Church Thrift House which has helped fund local charitable organizations. She loved to assist at the church sponsored after school tutoring program, in conjunction with Inwood Elementary School, which was staffed by many dedicated church volunteers. She was active in the Beymer United Methodist Women, serving as President for several years.

Gerry was also active in the Beymer church choir and Sunday school classes. She loved serving her Lord and loved her friends both in and outside of the church.

Gerry requested that her ashes be sprinkled on the grounds of the church she loved so well. A service will take place at a later date.
