Angus Douglas Williams, Jr. died peacefully in Tallahassee on January 10, 2023. He was born in Graceville, Florida in February of 1929 to Nellie Floy and Angus Douglas Williams.

A University of Florida graduate, Doug served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War before pursuing a thirty-year career as an insurance agent in Panama City, where he raised a family and retired before later moving to Tallahassee.

Doug was faith-filled, kind, loving and funny. He cherished time with family and friends. He was a great dance partner, average golfer, and lifelong Gators fan. Equal to his zest for life was his huge heart and notable appetite.

“Just call me boiled ham - I’m always ready!” he quipped when asked to help a friend, lend a hand at church, or join a road trip to see the grandchildren. His generous, inclusive spirit drew new and old friends and family near at every stage of life.

Doug’s faith burned bright and quiet throughout his life. His belief that “we are all God’s children” - a lesson his grandfather “Preacher” Wilson delivered sermons on - was evident in how he treated everyone.

Doug is survived by his beloved sweetheart of many years, Mary "Bunny" Smith, his daughters Genie James and Sheila Hardeman, his granddaughter Shelley Hardeman, grandson Terry Hardeman and – as he called them - his "sweet gumdrop grandchildren," Aila and Garret Hardeman.
