Anna H. Duncan, died February 20, 2018 at Westminster Oaks. Anna was born on the 14th of October 1936 in Beirut, Lebanon, the daughter of Chester and Ada Hutcheson. She spent most of her childhood in Latakia, Syria where her parents were missionaries. Anna spent most of her adult life in Olathe, Kansas and Tallahassee, Florida.

She graduated from Olathe High School in 1954 and Park College, Parkville, Missouri in 1958. She received her Master's degree from Florida State University in 1978. Her career included teaching Home Economic and food service management. Anna spent 4 years as a supervisor in Leon County Schools and 31 years at Florida High. She retired in 2003 as Director of School Food Service. During her career she was elected as president of the Florida School Food Service Association and served as a member of the American School Food Association Board.

Upon retirement Anna took several trips with family and friends. She was proud of her son Ted and her daughter Jennifer Dutton and their families. She was especially fond of her grandchildren, Drew, Mary Cate, Madeline, Nathan and Camille. She also enjoyed volunteering as a docent in Tallahassee's many historical places. Hiking was a favorite pastime.

Anna was a lifelong member of the Reformed Presbyterian Church and the Presbyterian Church USA. She was an active member of the Fellowship Presbyterian Church in Tallahassee, Florida where she served as Elder and Deacon as well Moderator of the Presbyterian Women.

She is preceded in death by her twin sister, Martha. She is survived by her brothers, Harold Hutcheson of Pittsburgh, PA and Norman Hutcheson of Smithville, MO.
