



## Argyrios Nitsios

November 1, 1924 - November 22, 2020

Argyrios Nitsios, 96, of Tallahassee and formerly a longtime resident of Darnestown, Maryland, passed away Sunday, November 22, 2020 at his home. He was preceded in death in 2018 by his wife of 60 years, Anastasia Nitsios.

Born in Fragista, Greece, Mr. Nitsios immigrated to the United States in 1960 and settled in Maryland. He and his wife moved to Tallahassee from Darnestown five years ago. He retired from New York Life after more than 50 years' service. Mr. Nitsios and his wife were very active members of the Greek Orthodox Church.

Survivors include two daughters, Helen Nitsios and her husband Shezad Sanallah of Tallahassee and Irene Nitsios of Bethesda, MD; his son Vasilios "Charles" Nitsios and his wife Barbara Nitsios of Towson, MD; and three grandchildren, Marcus Argyrios Nitsios, Anastasia Nitsios and Ariana Sanallah.

The funeral service will be held Monday, November 30th at 10:30 A.M. at Holy Mother of God Greek Orthodox Church, 1645 Phillips Road in Tallahassee.
