Audry Carter, Jr., 82, of Tallahassee, passed away on July 5, 2013. He is survived by his wife of 50 years, Sue Carter.

Audry was born in Medart, Florida and moved to Tallahassee as a young boy. He served under General Patton's 3rd Armored Division in the United States Army during the Korean War. He would later retire as Director of Administrations from the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, State of Florida. He was a member of Thomasville Road Baptist Church.
