She taught emotionally handicapped children and later became the media specialist at Covenant Community School in Tallahassee, Florida where she worked for 14 years.

Debbie met her husband, Jeff, in the winter of 1972 and they married in June of 1976. For the past 47 years they have been nearly inseparable. Debbie was also a loving mother to her two beautiful children, Jennifer Trostle Stewart and Andrew Thomas Trostle.

Her lamp does not go out at night. 19 She puts her hands to the distaff, and her hands hold the spindle. 20 She opens her hand to the poor and reaches out her hands to the needy. 21 She is not afraid of snow for her household, for all her household are clothed in scarlet. 22 She makes bed coverings for herself; her clothing is fine linen and purple. 23 Her husband is known in the gates when he sits among the elders of the land. 24 She makes linen garments and sells them; she delivers sashes to the merchant. 25 Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come. 26 She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue. 27 She looks well to the ways of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. 28 Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: 29 “Many women have done excellently, but you surpass them all.” 30 Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised. 31 Give her of the fruit of her hands, and let her works praise her in the gates.

Indeed! In the Resurrection our children will rise up and call her blessed, as will I and praise her.
