My work at Goodwill, as a Donation Acquisition Specialist, gave me tremendous joy to have the chance to make a real impact to improve people's lives. I owe gratitude and am truly grateful to my coworkers, friends, and professional relationships made while working at Goodwill, many of whom assisted me on my journey home.

Preceding me in death were my parents, grandparents, and my oldest sister, Kathleen L. Eyles. In November 2022, I unexpectedly lost my husband, Lyman Douglas Lemacks. I had the privilege of donating my kidney to my brother, Mark James Eyles, in August of 2005. He resides in Saco, Maine with his

wife, Terry Eyles. To my coworkers at Goodwill, I am thankful for assisting me after the death of my husband. I also want to acknowledge the emotional support and steadfast loyalty I received from my precious brother, Mark.

I have always enjoyed my dogs.
