Donald R. Cooper, age 75, passed away Nov. 6, 2019 due to complications from Parkinson's disease. Don was born in Marianna and was a lifelong resident of Tallahassee. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1966 to 1969. Don was retired from Barnett Bank with 23 years of service. His second career was with the State of Florida, Dept. of Insurance- Deferred Comp. Don was a member of Immanuel Baptist Church where he served as a Sunday school teacher and Deacon in his younger years. He had served as Past President and Lt. Gov. with the Tallahassee Civitan Club. 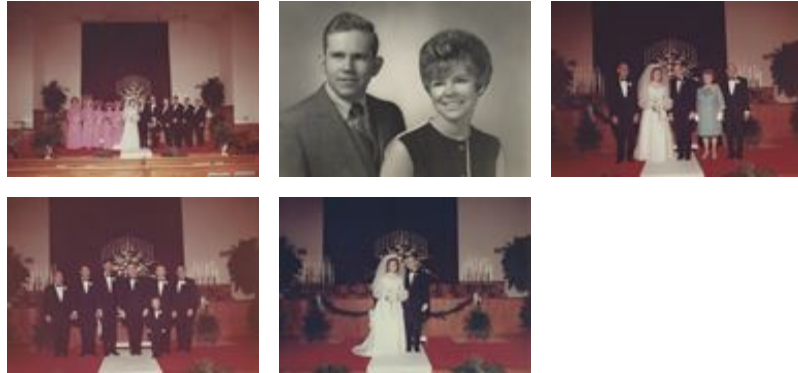

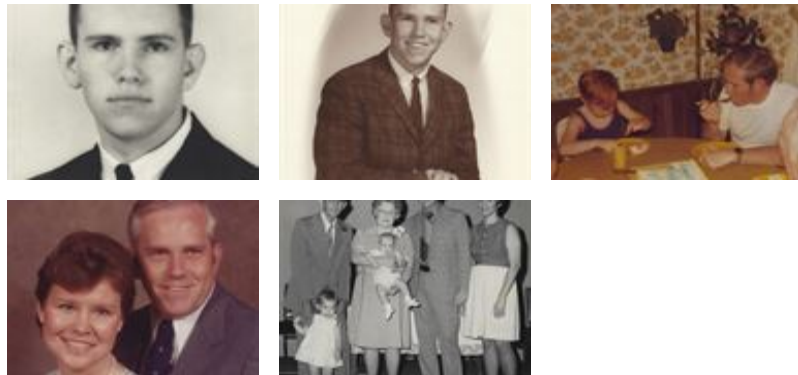
