Ellen Walden left behind a legacy of love when she passed away peacefully on April 21, 2023 in Tallahassee, Florida. Ellen Marie Linden was born on February 1, 1941, in Rochester, New York to Carl Theodore Linden and Minnie Louisa Young. Her family relocated to Birmingham, Alabama when she was a young girl. She enjoyed church activities and was an accomplished pianist as a girl. She graduated from Ramsey High School in 1958 where she was a member of the Girls Athletic Club. She enrolled in an all-women's college before transferring to the University of Alabama where she met Tom Walden at the Soup Shop, he offered to drive a group of girls home and dropped Ellen off at the wrong dorm. Regardless, Ellen married Thomas Lehman Walden on March 5 1960 in Birmingham, Alabama, had five children and a long, happy marriage.

The Walden family settled in Central Florida in the early 1970s. Ellen was a devoted wife and mother. Cheering on her children in sports, running and tennis filled up her free time. As her children grew older, she worked at Teague Middle School, ECC and Cubic Corp. She enjoyed her retirement spending time with her grandchildren and her close girlfriends.
