Elpis Demetrelis passed away June 25, 2016. She was 90 years old. She was born Elpis Heropoulos on July 6, 1925 in Canton, Ohio. She was preceded in death by her much beloved husband of 41 years Manuel Demetrelis, founding member of The Holy Mother of God Greek Orthodox Church in Tallahassee, Florida. She is predeceased by her mother Evanthia, father Anastasios, beloved aunt "Thia Toula", uncle Alexander and brothers Paul and Chris. She is survived by two brothers, George and Anthony. 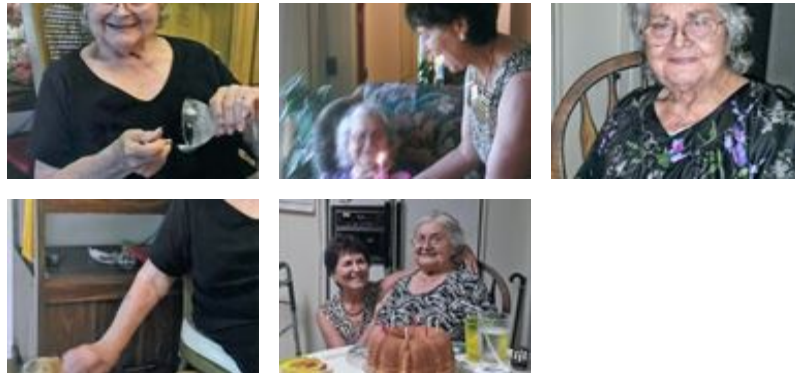
