



Gary "Randy" Luttrell

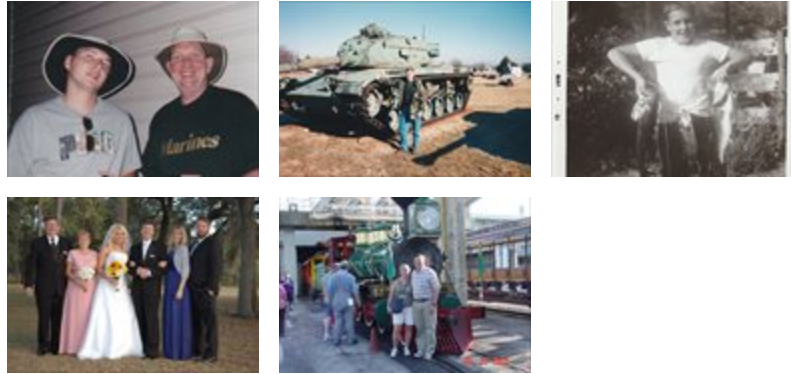
December 30, 1950 - September 9, 2014
