Harold "Harry" Clifford Sweat of Faulk Drive in Tallahassee, FL passed away on Friday, February 16th at 3 am after a long courageous battle with lung cancer. Harry was an avid off shore fisherman, and especially loved landing a Kingfish [King Mackerel]. He was a true Seminole football fan, known to be quick with a joke, was a political philosopher, and loved debating JFK theories.

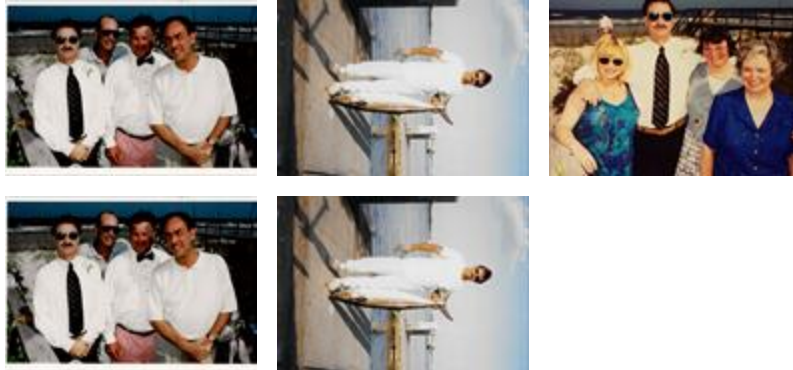
