



Jeanette Breland Hull

Jeanette Breland Hull, 76 years old, died peacefully in Tallahassee, FL at Tapestry Assisted Living on November 7, 2018.

She was the daughter of Carl Forest and Mary Louise Breland and grew up primarily in Solomons, Maryland. She graduated Western Maryland College, now McDaniel College, and spent a semester in France enhancing her French language proficiency. She told numerous stories of hitchhiking across Europe as a primary means of travel in the early 60's. She taught high school French in multiple jurisdictions including Shenandoah County, VA. After her marriage to John M. Bauserman ended, she returned to Southern Maryland and entered the banking industry. She and her second husband Joseph Stephen Hull, moved to Key West, FL from Crofton, MD., where they lived for several years. Upon the dissolution of her second marriage, she drove a taxi on the island before relocating to Tallahassee. She then obtained a Master's degree in Library Science from Florida State University, graduating in the same year as her son earned his bachelor's degree. She then worked for the Employee Benefits Research Institute in Washington, DC for 13 years until her retirement in 2004. She indulged in world travel, including an African safari, completed an Outward Bound program in California and lived in Belize for four months. After retirement, she returned to Tallahassee, FL to be closer to her son and grandchildren and reignite her passion for Bridge at the Tallahassee Senior Center.

She is survived by her son, John D. (JD) Bauserman of Tallahassee; two

grandchildren, Sarah and Andrew of Tallahassee; a sister, Dona Breland Collins (Ed) of Winchester, VA; a brother, Gary Carl Breland (Nancy) of Jupiter, FL; an uncle, Charles Murphree of Decatur, AL; and she was an Aunt to multiple nieces and nephews in Maryland and Florida. She is also survived by extended family of 1st cousins in Alabama, Georgia and Colorado.
