



## Jo Ann Clark Amidon

September 26, 1934 - June 3, 2014

Jo Ann Clark Amidon, 79, died Tuesday, June 3, 2014 at Tallahassee Memorial Hospital after suffering a stroke.

Born September 26, 1934 in Remington, Indiana, to George and Alberta Clark, Jo graduated from Linden High School in Linden, Indiana and earned a degree in English from MacMurray College in Jacksonville, Illinois.

She married James Lee Amidon in Grosse Point, Michigan on July 1, 1961 and celebrated 53 years of marriage.

Surviving are her husband; four sons, William Amidon (Laurie), Steven Amidon (Dixi), James Amidon, Jr. (Christine), and Frank Amidon (Carrie); six grandchildren living in Alaska, Indiana, and Florida; and her cousins, Skip and Kay Kay Adkins.
