Joel Henry Foy (62), passed away on February 16, 2026, in Tallahassee, Florida. He was a loving husband, father, grandfather, electrician, and business owner.

Born in Tallahassee, he was the youngest of six children of Harold and Mable Foy. Joel graduated from Godby High School in 1981. Joel met his wife, MaryAnn, in 1986 and they married in 1989. Joel and MaryAnn had two children and would have celebrated their 37th wedding anniversary in November of 2026.
