John F. Goble, 55, died Saturday October 29, 2011 after a courageous battle with cancer. Forever a Wildcat, John completed his undergraduate and Master's studies from the University of Kentucky. He earned his Ph. D. in Marriage and Family Therapy in 1997 from Florida State University. John was employed by Capital Health Plan and Tallahassee Memorial Behavioral Health Center.

John's family will welcome friends and colleagues on Friday November 11, from 6:00PM until 9:00 PM. A rosary will be said at 8:30 PM. Visitation will be held at the Co-Cathedral of St. Thomas More, located at the corner of Woodward and Tennessee Streets. A Mass of the Resurrection will be celebrated on Saturday November 12 at 10:00 AM, also at the Co-Cathedral of St. Thomas More.

Since the early 1990's, John has been an active scout leader with the Boy Scouts of America. He cherished the time he spent camping at Wallwood Boy Scout Camp with his sons and other troop members. As an active parishioner of the Co-Cathedral of St. Thomas More, John served on various church committees including the Men of St. Joseph, the hospitality committee and as Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus.

John is survived by his wife of 27 years, Mary as well as children, Charlie, Alexis, Catherine and William. He is also survived by his mother, Ruby Joyce Goble and his sister Linnet Ingram. Additional survivors include his two football loving canine companions, Gracie Elizabeth and Zoey Francis. He is

predeceased by his father Charles F. Goble.

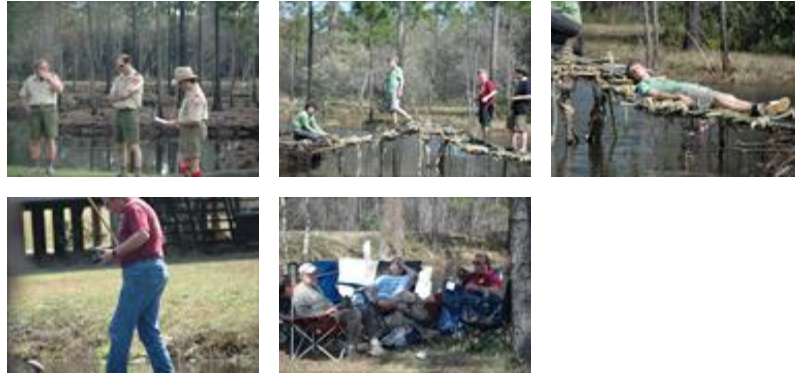
