If asked to name one colleague who has impressed me the most in my whole career experience as a respectable virtuous professional, it is no other than John. I spent only two short years at Albany State. When the then ASU administration's outrageous mismanagement of academic and financial affairs became intolerable, I confronted them. My attitude provoked even more ferocious retaliation. They took illegal and oppressive administrative measures against me. Only John and the union of which he was president supported me. John was in fact a legal adviser to me. Even though the administration later turned out to be a big scandal in Albany and Georgia University System after I left ASU, without John's help, they could have almost buried me alive. For that reason, I owe John and will remember him as long as I live.
