John Alden Rogers, Jr., a longtime resident of Tallahassee, went home to be with his Lord and Savior on January 11th, 2025. He will be dearly missed by his wife of 52 years, Kathy Rogers; his son, John "Trip" Rogers; grandchildren Hunter, Lily, and William; his daughter-in-law, Julia; sister Jarue Rogers Cabezas; and 5 nieces and nephews.

John was born in Durham, NC on December 4th, 1949, to John Alden Rogers, Sr. and Willie Vogler Rogers. John attended Ocala High School, graduating in 1968. He then received degrees from Central Florida Junior College and Florida State University before receiving his J.D. from Florida State University.

John had an interest in government and politics from an early age. He first helped conduct polls at the age of 11 and went on to work on political campaigns across the state. He also served as a Cabinet aide to the State Treasurer & Insurance Commissioner. Following this, he worked for New York Life until beginning a career lobbying with the Florida Retail Federation, serving as Vice President and General Counsel.

He was very active in his church and in various service organizations and faith-based initiatives, including: Kiwanis, Seminole Boosters, and the Florida United Methodist General Conference. He served on the Board of Trustees for Bethune-Cookman University as well as on the Board of Directors for the

Leon County chapter of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He started several men's Bible studies.

A memorial service will be held at 3:00PM on Friday, January 17, 2025, at Bevis Funeral Home, 200 John Knox Road, with a reception immediately following.

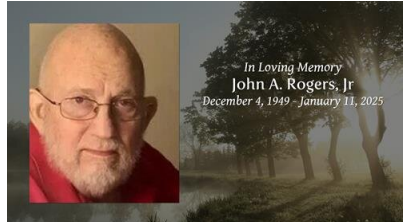
