Joseph Adelman, 93, passed away on Friday, March 8, 2013 at Cherry Laurel Retirement Center after a short illness.

Joseph was born on November 14, 1919 in Harlem, New York, where he spent his young life until he joined the United States Army. He received many commendations for acts of heroism and good conduct. He also received the World War II Victory Medal and the American Theatre Service Medal.

He was employed for 38 years by the FAA and retired from the U.S.

Department of Transportation and the Federal Aviation Administration on October 20, 1977. After his retirement he moved his family to the Tallahassee area.

Much of his retirement was spent doing wood working, painting, and enjoying his computer. His life was comprised of studying, research and he was an author of children's stories.

Joseph is preceded in death by his parents Jacob and Katie Adelman and his first wife, Anne.
