Joseph Brindisi, 83, passed away on March 7, 2026, in Tallahassee, Florida. He was born on August 7, 1942 in Lodi, NJ, the son of Frank and Mary (Taormina) Brindisi.

Joe, as he preferred to be called, graduated from the University of Miami, class of 1965, with a Bachelor's in Music. Following graduation, he worked as a high school band director and teacher at Miami Edison Senior High School. 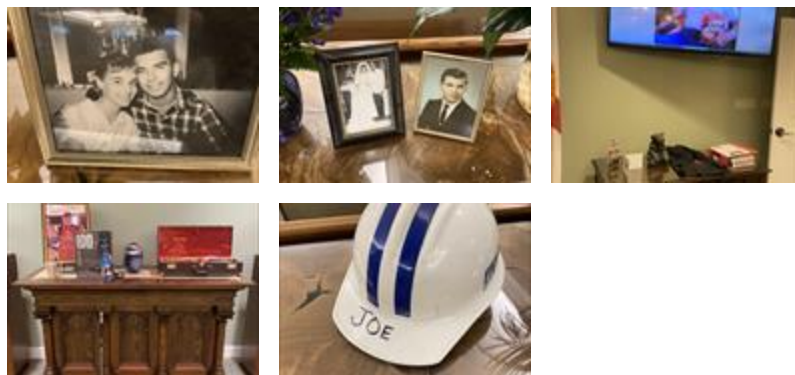
