Born on June 11, 1941, in Tallahassee, Florida, at Johnstown Hospital, Joe was raised in Woodville, where he developed a deep love for the outdoors. After moving to Tallahassee in the 8th grade, Joe attended Leon High School, where he met his high school sweetheart, Nancy Ausley Hannon. 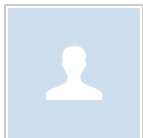
