Kathryn Henrietta ("Henny") Shasteen died September 16, 2021, at her home in Tallahassee, Florida surrounded by her family.

Born June 13, 1942, in Nashville, Tennessee, she was the daughter of the late Kathryn Jameson Wilson and Ernest Theodore Wilson.

Upon returning to Nashville, she worked for the Methodist Publishing House. In 1968, she married Dr. Bill Shasteen at West End United Methodist Church. They moved to Huntsville, Alabama in 1975, where they raised their three daughters and remained there

until retiring to Clifftops in Monteagle, Tennessee.

She worked part time for a travel agency and the Art League and did volunteer work for the Huntsville Symphony Orchestra Guild and the Women's Guild of the Huntsville Museum of Art. She was a member of The Carillon Club and the Madison County Medical Auxiliary. She enjoyed traveling, playing bridge, her garden club, the MAM club, and Bookmarks book club. She was a wonderful cook and shared a love of all animals and nature with her husband and family.

Henny will be remembered as a wonderful wife, loving mother, doting grandmother and devoted sister and friend. To know her was to love her and she will be missed dearly.
