



Kenneth T. Causseaux

Kenneth T. Causseaux, born May 5, 1929, passed away on March 24, 2015 surrounded by his family at Big Bend Hospice.

He was a lifelong resident of Tallahassee and served his community as a dedicated Public Servant. He began his career in Law enforcement in 1950 with the Tallahassee Police Department. After several years on foot patrol, he was transferred to headquarters and assigned responsibilities in fingerprinting, crime scene investigation and traffic control. At this time he was promoted to Sergeant.

Kenneth was promoted to Lieutenant in 1956 and was instrumental in creating the city's first traffic unit. He was a forceful advocate in protecting young drivers and organized a traffic school to further educate and promote safe driving. He was promoted to Captain in 1963.

In 1974 he was appointed by the City Manager as the City's first Safety Director. He enjoyed teaching safety training classes and CPR for employees in high-risk occupations. He also worked closely with the Leon County Health Department to screen employees for many health related problems and promote overall employee wellness. He was in this position until his retirement in 1986.

Kenneth was a dedicated family man, and friend to everyone he met. When he wasn't involved in his many projects around the family home, he loved to cook, listen to music and was an avid storyteller sharing many entertaining stories about the history of his treasured community.

Kenneth is survived by his beloved wife of 66 years Polly, his daughter Maryann (Van), his son Tom (Rhonda), his daughter Cynthia (George) and four grandchildren, Whip (Meg), Christopher (Julia), Jennifer and Reiner, He had five great-grandchildren, Georgia, Molly, Ness, Trevor and Trenton.

A private family funeral was held on March 27, 2015 with Rev. Dr. Michael W. Petty of St. Peters Anglican Church officiating.
