Kimberly Ann Walker of Monticello Florida ended her battle with cancer on September 23, 2023 at the age of 56. She is survived by her husband Gregg, parents Rick and Carol Johnson, her sister Denise, brother-in-law Matt Forschner and their adult children; Alexis, Erica and Jacob.

Kimberly was taken from us well before her time and will be remembered for her fighting spirit, her devotion to friends and family, her amazing memory and attention to detail, and her love for cross stitching and all things British (unfortunately, Jane Austen wasn't available to write this). She worked for almost 20 years at Walt Disney World in Orlando before following her husband-to-be to Tallahassee in 2010. She eventually found her way to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection where she was employed in accounting and grant management for the restoration projects associated with the Deepwater Horizon program. She continued to work part time from home until just days prior to her passing.

Kimberly and Gregg often reflected on some amazing times together. First, their wedding at Leu Gardens in Orlando on 10/10/10 which was blessed with amazing sunlight and the greenest surroundings imaginable. Second, two wonderful (if not exhausting) trips to Europe which cannot be easily summarized. And third, watching hundreds of fireflies from their back porch, performing just for them, each spring and summer.

Up until the very end, she was contemplating the next trip to Europe as well as getting back into the swim spa which was installed in 2022 along with backyard landscaping that created a wonderful and peaceful retreat (aside from the ongoing weeding!).

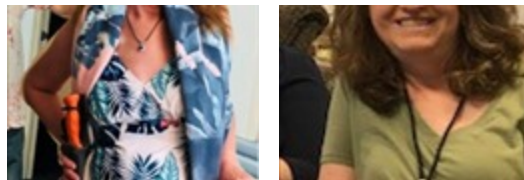
