



Larry Stewart Dormany

February 6, 1924 - June 10, 2017

Larry S. Dormany, one of the members of the Greatest Generation died peacefully in Tallahassee, Florida on June 10, 2017 after 93 well lived years. He was born February 6, 1924 in Plant City, Florida to Larry Greene and Mary Anna Dormany. He was the great-grandson of Manual and Evelina Weatherford Gonzalez, founders of Ft. Myers, FL and the grandson to early Plant City settlers John J. and Sarah Walden Dormany.

Larry was a graduate of Plant City High School and entered the United States Marine Corps in 1942 at the start of WWII. Larry's service included stationing at Pearl Harbor and deployment in the brutally difficult but successful invasion of the Marshall Islands. After WWII he returned home to Florida and graduated from the former Tampa Business College. He married the love of his life, Letha Hutchings and they were married over 50 years until Letha's death in 2003.

Larry was employed by the Greyhound Corporation for 35 years. He was most passionate about his family, a member of the Olin S. Wright Masonic Lodge 79, and a lifetime member and St. Peters Episcopal Church and also served on the vestry.

He was preceded in death by his wife Letha and son Larry Stephen Dormany. He is survived by his daughter Karen Mica (David), grandson David Mica Jr. (Mary Caroline), granddaughters Julianne and Allison Mica, as well as a great-grandson, David Mica III.
