September 13, 1939 - October 23, 2024

With profound sadness and gratitude for a life beautifully lived, we announce the peaceful passing of Laura Ann Bizzell, née Wills, on October 23, 2024. Surrounded by the loving family she nurtured throughout her 85 years, Laura's final moments reflected the grace and warmth that defined her remarkable life. Born on September 13, 1939, to Walter Guy and Lucibel Wills, in Dothan, Alabama, Laura embarked on a journey that would touch countless lives through her extraordinary capacity for love and her gift for creating family wherever she went.

Laura's childhood took root in Tallahassee, where her family relocated during her early years. She created many lasting friendships throughout her school years and was an alumna of Leon High School. On December 14, 1956, Laura married Robert "Mac" McBride, and together they had four children: Lorre, Robert, Jeff, and Gregg. Throughout their 17-year marriage and after its end in 1974, Laura's primary focus remained on her children, dedicating herself to their wellbeing and growth with unwavering devotion.

In the 1970s, Laura began her professional journey working in DC Wheeler's men's clothing stores, where her natural grace and attention to detail served her well. Her career path then led her to the Florida House of Representatives, where she rose to become Documents Supervisor. In this role, she found particular joy in mentoring the young staff members who joined her team during legislative sessions. Her leadership style, marked by warmth and wisdom, created an atmosphere where both work and relationships

thrived. Colleagues remember her not just as a supervisor, but as a mentor whose influence extended far beyond the workplace.

In 1976, love found Laura again in Donald Bizzell, a partnership that would prove to be a testament to love's enduring power. Their blended family grew to include Don's daughters, Beverly and Jennifer, whom Laura embraced with the same boundless affection she held for her own. Their love story wrote its most poignant chapter in their later years when Don, his memory softened by dementia, fell in love with Laura anew and asked for her hand once more. Their vow renewal, blessed by their children, became a celebration of love's ability to transcend even time's passage.

A Legacy of Love

At the heart of the Bizzell home was Laura's beloved kitchen, affectionately known as the "My-T-Fine Café." Here, she created memorable dishes including her baked spaghetti, chocolate cake, and the crown jewel – cornbread dressing and gravy that became the cornerstone of countless family gatherings. Then there was the infamous year that the oven died, chaos ensued, and no one could find that spoon, that is until we got to the bottom of that dressing pan. Thanksgiving at Laura's table was more than a meal; it was a celebration of family, both born and chosen, where every guest was embraced as kin.

Known lovingly as "Gees" to her eighteen grandchildren and seventeen great-grandchildren, Laura's presence graced every possible family milestone. Her dedication to family extended beyond blood ties to embrace grandnieces, grandnephews, and friends, all of whom found a home in her heart.

To the younger generation, she leaves behind her love and the wisdom of Proverbs 4, with emphasis on Verse 23: "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it."

Faith and Service

Laura's faith formed the foundation of her life's work. As a devoted member of

Tallahassee Heights Methodist Church, she found joy in serving with the "Kitchen Angels," her voice lifting in praise with the summer choir, and her hands busy in the fall pumpkin patch. Her creative spirit found expression in the stories and poems she penned for her family, including treasured tales like "Bobby Butterfly," "Ginger Runs Away," and "A Girl Called Lucy" – written legacies that will continue to delight generations to come.

Family Legacy

Laura was the true matriarch of a large, diverse, and loving family. She was preceded in death by her husband, Donald J. Bizzell, her parents Guy and Lucy Wills, her sisters, Mary and Thersa, and brother Walt. She is survived by six children, Lorre Howell (Joseph Sr), Robert McBride III (Martha), Jeffrey McBride (Rose), William "Gregg" McBride (Yenys), Beverly Aiken (Bruce), and Jennifer Van Dyke (Kevin) and her brother-in-law Bob Dorsey (Mary).

Laura had the blessing of calling 18 people grandchildren.
