



## Lynne Marie Ewen

November 25, 1954 - August 23, 2021

Lynne Marie Ewen, 66, passed away at 3:10 p.m. on Monday, August 23rd after losing her battle with Covid 19 related issues inside of the I.C.U. at the Capital Regional Medical Center.

Lynne will be remembered as a gentle, loving soul who strived to see the good in all those she met. For her, the glass wasn't half-full, it was brimming to the top. Lynne enjoyed a 42-year-career as a compassionate nurse in the neonatal intensive care unit at the Tallahassee Memorial Hospital. For Lynne, it was important that these "young tykes", as she called them, received the best professional and loving care she could provide. Even when she retired last year, Lynne would call to stay in touch with her colleagues and get updated information on new arrivals.

Lynne was born on November 25th, 1954 in Springfield, Massachusetts to Russell and Ann Demarais. She was the couple's first child in a family that eventually included two brothers (David and James) and a sister, Denise. Her family eventually moved to South Florida, where Lynne attended Broward Community College. She continued her education at Florida State University and earned her RN degree in the school's nursing program.

Lynne was a devoted Christian in the Catholic Church. Her faith gave her great comfort and she faithfully practiced the Biblical teachings in her daily life. She had a knack for always putting a positive spin on life's daily challenges that came with work, family and raising a teenage son.

Her two greatest joys during her lifetime were having her son, Nathanael, and

her 40-year marriage to her husband, Michael. As she stated many times to her husband, "We may not be perfect, but we're perfect for each other." Even picking her son's name had importance to her. "Nathanael" biblically means "A Gift From God." She continued to dote on her son, now 23, until her untimely death.

She also enjoyed playing "candy crush" on her laptop, watching contestants battling it out on Wheel of Fortune and Jeopardy and enjoying the company of her four kitty cats. Enjoying country music and a voracious appetite for reading Stephen King and John Gresham novels occupied other moments of her time.

Lynne is survived by her father and mother, a loving sister, Denise and a brother, James. Her other brother, David, preceded her in death in 1975. She left behind many friends, colleagues and a grieving husband and son.

Lynne's life will be celebrated during a 6 p.m. memorial service at the Bevis Funeral Home on Wednesday, September 1st.
