Marjorie Ward Blair, 91, passed away peacefully Sunday, May 24, 2026, following a brief illness. Her daughter Deborah was by her side. She entered the gates of heaven hearing those famous words “job well done my good and faithful servant “.

A fifth generation Alabama native, Marjorie was born on April 26, 1935, in Dothan, Alabama to Bessie Lewis Ward and Ernest Ralph Ward. Her family later moved to Marianna, Florida, where she graduated from Marianna High School. A proud FSU alumni, Marjorie enjoyed a long career in Social Work, working very passionately and diligently with the developmentally disabled.

Her first job assignment following graduation from FSU was in Live Oak, Florida, and it was there that she met her future husband, Charles Franklin Blair, a native of Jasper, Florida. They were married on January 24, 1959, celebrating over 50 years of marriage before the death of Charles on June 24, 2012.

Following retirement, the couple enjoyed numerous trips to Europe, Canada and various points of interest across the United States.

As a young family, they settled in Tallahassee, making it their home for over 55 years.

The epitome of a genial southern lady, she lived a life that was defined by her strong Christian faith, being an active member of Thomasville Road Baptist Church for over 50 years. A friend to her every acquaintance, she looked for the good in people, and was always a willing contributor for any endeavor that was of benefit to a friend or neighbor.

The consummate Southern Hostess, Marjorie hosted numerous family gatherings for decades, always serving her trademark fresh vegetables and fresh fruit with each meal. Marjorie was an accomplished cook and homemaker, maintaining an immaculate home. She loved to host both Bridge and Bunco card games in her home.

Fiercely independent until her final days, she could often be found working in her yard. She voluntarily stopped driving in Tallahassee traffic at the age of 90.
