Martha Chapman Stanley, aka Beth, age 96 entered rest at her residence on August 27, 2021. She was born and raised on a farm in the rural area of New Hope, in Grottoes, Virginia. Sometime after high school she met and married her husband Don. They eventually moved to Miami where they raised their 3 children. In 1977 she and her husband transitioned to Tallahassee. Beth taught kindergarten most of her career and continued teaching after moving to Tallahassee. She was employed at North Florida Christian School until she retired in 1994. She was a member of Temple Baptist Church.

Beth was preceded in death by her husband Donovan L. Stanley in 2016.

Survivors include three children Donovan Llewellyn Stanley, Jr. of Tallahassee, Ronald Bryan Stanley and his wife Joanie of Pembroke Pines, FL., Karen Breman and her husband Jim of Monticello, FL.; six grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.
