



Mary Perry Kennedy Sturges

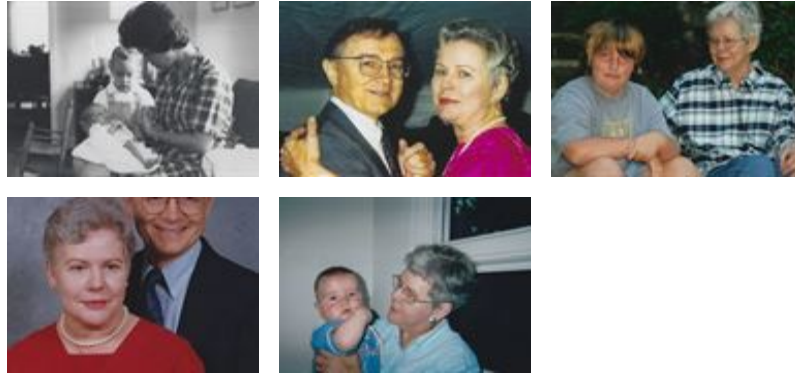
January 4, 1937 - October 12, 2017

Mary Perry Kennedy Sturges, 80, died peacefully in her sleep Thursday Oct 12th at home. She was the daughter of Susan Gould Kennedy and James Davidson "Dusty" Kennedy of Birmingham, AL. She graduated from Auburn in 1958 and lived in Virginia, Baltimore, Rhode Island, and moved to Tallahassee in 1972. She taught High School English as well as first grade, was a librarian, and volunteered teaching remedial reading to young children. She was a long-time volunteer at the Telephone Counseling and Referral Service hot line, she delivered Meals on Wheels for many years, and she taught in the Adult Literacy Program. She was especially active in the Episcopal Church; here at Holy Comforter she was on the Vestry, Junior Warden, altar guild, and Chairman of what was then called the Day School Board. She considered herself primarily a mother, wife, and homemaker. She was preceded in death by her parents, by her sister, Susan K. Porter of Atlanta, and her son William Gould Sturges. She was a kind, generous and loving woman, leaving behind a son, James W. Sturges of Los Angeles, a daughter, Sarah Frances Sturges of Tallahassee, two grandsons, Benjamin Sturges Watts and Keegan James Ang-Sturges, several cousins, many nieces and nephews, and her soul mate of over 60 years, Wilton (Tony) Sturges.
