November 8, 1935 - April 16, 2017

Nick E. Menacof passed away Sunday April 16, 2017 after a brief illness. Nick was born on November 8, 1935 to Helen and Mitchell Menacof in Brookville Indiana.

He graduated from Miami Edison High School and received his Bachelor's degree from Florida State University, while attending FSU Nick ran track and played on the basketball team. He received his Master's degree from the University of Tennessee. Nick was a high school and college basketball coach before becoming a school administrator.

In the early 80's Nick began serving as the public address announcer for many of the Florida State sporting events and was the Public Address Voice of Seminole Football for over 25 years before retiring in 2009. He was a longtime member of the Big Bend Football Officials Association and was part of the officiating team for the Seminole football practice sessions.

He is survived by his wife, Ellie Menacof, his children; Clint Menacof (Hannah), Nikki Menacof Enfinger, Cody Menacof (Debi), and step-son Brent Merryman (Karrie) and his five grandchildren, Garrett Enfinger, Dakota Enfinger, Ellison Menacof, Alden Menacof, and Cole Menacof.
