



## Ottavia Marie Angelo Webb

July 11, 1921 - July 24, 2023

Ottavia Marie “Mary” Angelo Webb, age 102, passed away July 24, 2023, in Tallahassee, Florida. Born on July 11, 1921, to Dominic Francis and Anna Caruso Angelo in Armstrong County, PA, she was received with joy by seven older siblings and extended family.

Upon completing her education, Mary moved to Pittsburgh to attend beauty school for hairdressing. To pay her tuition, she worked as a domestic for a family in Squirrel Hill.
