Poyntz Lejeune Roddenberry Silas, 91, of Tallahassee, went to be with her husband on December 14, 2015, which would have been their 69th wedding anniversary.

Lejeune was born on November 13, 1924, to Bernice and William Roddenberry in Sopchoppy. She moved to the Florida United Methodist Children's Home at the age of 11 and resided there until 1946. She was a 1944 graduate of Deland High School and attended Asbury College in Wilmore, KY.

Lejeune later moved to Tallahassee where she met and married Clinton Silas. Together, they owned and operated a dry cleaning and laundry business for many years. She later worked for Leon County Schools then FSU College of Education, where she retired in 1992. She was a longtime member of Lake Jackson United Methodist Church. She enjoyed writing sermons and messages of faith to present to the congregation. She also enjoyed writing poetry, much of it with a spiritual theme. She published 6 writings in Biblical Anthology.
