Richard E. Ham, age 85 of Tallahassee passed away peacefully on January 2, 2017. He is survived by his wife of 63 years Ann Ham and daughter Carol Ann. He is preceded in death by his parents, sister and brothers.

Richard was a professor emeritus at Ohio University and former professor at Florida State University in the field of Communication Disorders.

“ I am sorry to learn of Dr. Ham's passing. I was a stutterer, and I was blessed to work with him in 1955 when he was a graduate student at Purdue University. I was 13 years old. I recently wrote an essay about my going to speech therapy at Purdue. This is one paragraph: "I met with Mr. Ham daily for three weeks. Each session was 30-45 minutes. We pulled a couple of chairs together and talked about stuttering, how it felt. For example, he shared some basic research with me, findings such as stutterers almost always have no problem when they talk with animals. Our conversations helped me comprehend that my stuttering was not my fault and that I was okay even though I stuttered. The time spent with him was formative. Adjectives that come to mind include reassuring, comforting, and enlightening. After those sessions with Mr. Ham, I felt much better—more confident and less embarrassed (humiliated) by my speech challenges.”

I found out that he was at Ohio University and sent him a letter in 1969. He promptly sent me a very gracious letter. It was wonderful to reconnect with him.

I am much indebted to Dr. Ham and all that he did for me.
