



Richard Samuel Wintrode Jr

September 19, 1934 - March 29, 2020

Richard Samuel Wintrode Jr. passed away in Lakeland, Florida on March 29, 2020, at the age of 85. Born in Andrews, Indiana in 1934, he and his two brothers, David and Martin, and sister, Beverly, were raised in Detroit, Michigan by Richard Sr. and Helen Wintrode. He attended Southeastern High School and the Detroit Institute of Technology, graduating in 1956 with a bachelor's degree in accounting. Following graduation, he worked for the Internal Revenue Service for 36 years, retiring as the Executive Director for Northern Illinois in 1992. He married the love of his life, Susan Chaffee, in 1959, and they raised three children, Warren, Jack, and Jennifer, remaining married until her death in 2000. During retirement, he split his time between homes in Michigan and Lakeland, where he followed his beloved Tiger baseball team.

He is survived by his two brothers, Martin Wintrode and his wife Victoria, and David C. Wintrode. Richard is also survived by his son, Warren R. Wintrode, his son Jack Wintrode and his wife Lillie, and his daughter Jennifer Wintrode Shuler and her husband Dussia. Lastly, Richard is survived by three grandchildren and one great grandchild.
