



## Rosalie Nassau Lindamood

April 3, 1924 - January 6, 2021

Rosalie Lindamood passed away on the morning of 6 January, 2021, after a brief illness. She was 96.

She was born Rosalie Nassau in Jacksonville, Florida, in 1924, one of seven children of George and Mary Nassau. Rosalie lived in Jacksonville most of her life, working as a store clerk and bookkeeper after graduating from Jackson High School. In 1946 she married Frank Lindamood of Bluefield, West Virginia.

After the first of their four children was born, she became a full-time housewife. She was a consummate mother and homemaker. She kept a spotless house, made and mended clothes for her family, and was an accomplished cook who kept her household supplied with fresh pies, cakes and other culinary delights.

She was a charming and out-going woman, a fine ballroom dancer and a frequent volunteer worker in state and local political campaigns around Jacksonville, helping candidates seeking office from county commissioner to governor.

After her husband died in 1999, she often visited her daughter, Anita, in Rhode Island, where she spent many happy days going to yard sales and playing with the pet rabbit. In 2013, she entered Eden Springs nursing home in Wakulla County, Florida, close to her son Frank, Jr., who visited her every day. She remained there until her death, beloved by the staff and visitors alike. She is survived by her children, Frank, Jr., Anita, Arlene and John; her

grandchildren: David, Huckleberry, Moses, Joseph, Nicholas, Jessica and Karen; and her great grandchildren, Canon, MaKenzie and Nicolette.

There will be a private memorial ceremony this Spring.
