



## Roxy O'Brien

November 10, 1946 - October 31, 2015

Roxy O'Brien, 68, of Tallahassee, Florida, died unexpectedly on Saturday October 31, 2015 at her Tallahassee, Florida home.

Roxy was born Roxy June Hook on November 10, 1946 in Findlay, Ohio the eldest of the two children of Jack and Golda (Decker) Hook. Roxy was preceded in death by her brother Daniel J. Hook, 67, who died in Findlay, Ohio earlier in the day on Saturday.

Roxy is survived by her husband Scott O'Brien of Tallahassee Florida and her son Scott Ault (Jennifer), his sons Jack Ault and Cole Ault and Jennifer's daughter Katie Black.

Roxy and her husband Scott graduated from Findlay High School in 1964. Roxy began her career as an incentive travel professional in 1978 with E.F. McDonald & Company of Dayton, Ohio. After 4 years as an interior design franchisee of Expressions Furniture in Jacksonville Florida, Roxy retired as the incentive travel director of Fleming Companies, a national food distributor headquartered in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma in 1999. In that year Roxy, her husband Scott and Robert F. McCarthy of Glastonbury, Connecticut formed the incentive travel company Meetings by Design, LLC and in 2001 moved the company to Tallahassee. As the President of Meetings by Design, LLC Roxy lead the company's success until her death.

Roxy was a longtime member of the Society of Incentive Travel Executives (SITE) and the International Air Travel Association (IATA). In Tallahassee Roxy was actively involved in the Tallahassee Citizens' Police Academy

Alumni Association and for many years served as the chairperson of the Annual Police Ball in Tallahassee.

Roxy was full of life and traveled the world extensively spreading happiness everywhere she went. She was devoted to her family and friends and will be missed deeply by her family and all who knew her.
