Some people move through the world quietly. Others leave it brighter than they found it. Tawni Stone Glover was one of those rare souls whose presence felt like sunshine – warm, comforting, joyful, and impossible to forget.

Tawni passed peacefully into the arms of her Savior on Mother's Day, surrounded by the love she so freely gave throughout her life. Though her family and friends grieve deeply, they also carry immense gratitude for having known a woman who loved so fully, laughed so easily, and made ordinary moments feel meaningful.

Tawni had a remarkable gift for turning strangers into friends and friends into family. Through thoughtful gestures and encouraging words, she made people feel valued, welcome, and deeply loved. She remembered birthdays, checked in when others forgot, and celebrated life's smallest moments with a genuine pop of enthusiasm.

Her faith was the foundation of her life. As an active member and devoted volunteer at Killlearn Methodist Church, Tawni lived her beliefs not only in her words but in her actions. She served with humility, compassion, and a joyful spirit that drew people toward her. She believed deeply in showing up for others, and she did – again and again.

Professionally, Tawni dedicated more than two decades to Childers Construction, where she was respected as a Project Manager and known for her integrity, professionalism, and unwavering care for others. She built lasting relationships with colleagues, clients, and partners alike, earning admiration not only for the quality of her work but for the kindness and compassion she brought to every interaction. To Tawni, success was never measured solely by completed projects but by the people she encouraged, supported, and uplifted along the way.

Long before mentoring became a buzzword, Tawni was already changing lives through service. Many of those girls grew up carrying lessons Tawni taught simply by example: lead with kindness, include others, work hard, and never underestimate the power of making someone feel important.

Tawni embraced life wholeheartedly. She found peace at the beach, joy in gathering the people she loved, and happiness in creating thoughtful gifts and lasting memories. She cherished her friends in the Tallahassee ParrotHead Club, where friendship, laughter, music, and volunteerism reflected her generous spirit. Tawni truly believed life was meant to be celebrated.

Tawni is survived by her devoted husband, Julius Glover; her beloved son, Sean O'Neill; and her siblings, Valerie Stone Gsell (husband Glenn), Markham Stone, and Terri Stone. She is also lovingly remembered by her nephews Drew Gsell (wife Asha) and Eric Gsell (wife Victoria); her nieces Courtney Gsell and Taylor Stone; and her great-nephew, Christian Gsell, all of whom held a special place in her heart. She is further survived by her stepdaughter, Rochelle Glover, and Terrie Ard (husband T.J.); her step-granddaughter, Jacqueline Ard; as well as numerous aunts, uncles, cousins, and cherished

friends whom she loved as family.

She was preceded in death by her beloved parents, Carlos and Waneta Stone, whose love and values helped shape the extraordinary woman she became.
