



Teresa J. Hernandez

October 3, 1927 - December 22, 2014

Teresa Jimenez Hernandez, 87, peacefully passed away after a brief illness on December 22, 2014, at her lakeside home in Tallahassee, Florida, where she had lived for 59 years.

She was born to Ramaldo and Laura Botello Jimenez on October 3, 1927 in Fort Worth, Texas. Her parents were migrant workers who traveled the mid-West, following the ripening crops north to Minnesota. She grew up in Easton, Minnesota, and married her childhood friend, Linus Hernandez, on September 23, 1949. She had three children, Debra, David, and Richard.

In 1955, Teresa moved with her family from Albert Lea, Minnesota to Tallahassee, Florida, and within a year had secured employment with the Florida Department of State, where she served faithfully as a public servant for 28 years until she retired in 1984. While there, she formed a strong friendship with co-worker Rhoda Pierce, with whom she maintained a deep bond for the next 30 years.

After retirement, Teresa remained busy, devoting herself to her family, traveling, and watching the Florida State University football games. Teresa enjoyed many hobbies, including sewing, crocheting, and quilting. She turned her love of cooking and baking into a rewarding business designing and making wedding cakes for many years.

She had been a member of Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church in Tallahassee since 1955, and participated in the Mother of Perpetual Health Circle and served as a President of the Women's Guild in 2001. She was also

a member of the Department of Agriculture's Spanish Trails Homemakers. She participated in many arts and crafts events making quilts, crocheting afghans, scarves, and hats, and sewing decorative aprons. She selflessly devoted her time to quilting lap blankets for disabled veterans, sewing tiny outfits for premature babies at Tallahassee Memorial Hospital, sewing "ouch" dolls for children getting immunizations from the Health Department, and sewing baptismal bibs for the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church.

Teresa was a cancer survivor, having been diagnosed in 1990 with breast cancer. Her faith in God and her doctors led to a successful battle, and she remained cancer-free for the remainder of her life.

After the death of her husband Linus on December 1, 2001, Teresa became reacquainted with a childhood friend from Albert Lea, Minnesota. On June 12, 2004 Teresa married John Alvarado, who moved to Tallahassee to be with Teresa. After his untimely death on March 1, 2010, Teresa remained in her Tallahassee home, enjoying the closeness of her Tallahassee family and friends.
