



## Timothy Anthony Leograndis

January 15, 1954 - January 16, 2026

Timothy Anthony Leograndis, age 72, passed away peacefully on January 16, 2026, in Tallahassee, Florida, one day after celebrating his 72nd birthday.

Tim was born in Framingham, Massachusetts, and raised in Southington, Connecticut. In 1995, he moved to Weston, Florida, where he lived with his family for 25 years. In 2020, Tim and his wife relocated to Tallahassee, Florida, which became his final home.

Tim is survived by his beloved wife of 50 years, Kathy; his children, Amanda and Eric; his cherished grandchildren, Harper and Luke; and his sister, Leesa. He was preceded in death by his eldest daughter, Sarah, in 2008.

Tim earned his education through community college and continued his studies at the Computer Processing Institute in Connecticut. He dedicated his professional career to computer processing and application development, working for major insurance companies in Connecticut. After moving to Florida, he continued his career and served as Head of Application Development at U.S. Sugar.

He was a devoted husband, a proud father, and found his greatest joy in being a grandfather to Harper and Luke. A gifted storyteller with a sharp wit, Tim had a natural way of pulling people in and lighting up any room he entered.

Tim's passions included playing golf and writing poetry, both of which reflected his thoughtful, sentimental nature. He was also committed to his community. Alongside his father, Tim helped develop the girls' softball organization in Southington, Connecticut, leaving a lasting impact on countless young athletes and families.

Timothy Anthony Leograndis will be remembered for his kindness, generosity, and the joy he brought to others through his stories, laughter, and presence. May his legacy live on in all who knew him.
