January 10, 1954 - July 15, 2021

William "Bill" Talmadge Armstrong traded his flight wings for angel wings on Thursday July 15, 2021, with his daughter and son-in-law by his side in Tallahassee, Florida. Bill was 67 years young.

Bill was born January 10, 1954 to parents William T. Armstrong, Sr. and Rosalia Filippello Armstrong in Tampa, Florida where he enjoyed a childhood filled with many Italian family meals and fun times spent together. In high school, his family moved to Orange County and Bill lived in the Orange County area the remainder of his life.

In 1975 he began his career as a Law Enforcement Officer with the Orange County Sheriff's Office (OCSO). Bill worked a combined 43 years as a Law Enforcement Officer and Pilot, in various capacities and with several agencies. Bill retired in 2019 as a Commander with OCSO.

Bill was close with and proud of his daughter, grand-daughter and son-in-law and would frequently spend time with them. Bill was the person many family and friends would confide in, depend on for advice or reach out to in a time of need. He was always a strong, steady voice of reason, positivity and humor (though be it dark, but if you knew Bill, you appreciated that).

Bill was known to do what was right even if it was not popular and was a true

peacemaker. He will be missed by many.

Survivors include his loving daughter Dana Danielle Lane, son-in-law Logan Lane; granddaughter Lillie Grace Green; bonus grandchildren Logan and Lauren; brother Norman Armstrong, brother-in-law Gregory Pszonek as well as many other family members and friends who will remember him fondly. Bill is now reunited with his parents and his brother, David Armstrong, who preceded him.

He made it very clear as a kid one day he would be a police officer and that dream for him came true , he was dedicated protector of the people for over 40 years, But what really impressed me is when he became a pilot. I would brag about him in conversations with friends.

We were always close in spite of the distance between us after I moved to California in 1985. After our mom passed 14 years ago it was just he and I in our nuclear family and I told him he was going to take on the weekly calls from me and we did call each other once a week. I will miss those conversations until we meet again big brother.

I know one of the proudest moments in his life is when his daughter Dana was born. He and I would chat about her in every conversation and I know he loved her with all his heart . He was so proud of what Dana became , a fantastic mom, smart , independent , compassionate human being. He also love loved loved his granddaughter LG and watching her grow into a wonderful young lady He was not worried about leaving the two of them on this earth because they are in good hands with my nephew-in-law Logan. Billy and I had conversation and he was at peace with knowing Logan would be there for the both of them.

I was so fortunate to have spent 10 days with him this past June, we had conversations about our child hood memories , life and death, spirituality, our family. We cried numerous times , and I have to say that was a first for me to see my brother cry.I think he always felt he had to be the rock and could finally let all that go.

I will miss you and love you with all my heart my dear brother. You are a part of who i am today and I will always cherish the impact you have had on my life. I know your spirit will be with all of us.

When I started working in dispatch and other law enforcement jobs, we’d talk at least weekly and swap stories about crazy things that happened at work. I know he enjoyed those moments as much as I did!

As a teenager he taught me how to drive “defensively” and would frequently quiz me on “what if” traffic scenarios to make sure I knew how to react. He taught me how to mow the yard, wash and take care of my car, use the grill, plan ahead for all things and most of all, to be a strong and independent person.

As most pilots do, he had an even keel, and was always patient and levelheaded...if only I could say the same for me! One time when I was 15, I was driving to Orlando with my dad on the turnpike. As we approached the toll booth I was so nervous about stalling out, as my skills for driving a stick shift were not the best. In his calm voice he said “don’t worry about everyone else you will be just fine. You know what you’re doing, just take a deep breath and relax...what’s the worst that can happen?” So I reach out and grab the ticket from the toll plaza attendant, roll the window up and proceed to stall out 3 times! He just kept reassuring me, while traffic backed up for what felt like a mile behind us...I finally got it and we drove away. “See you did just fine”. In times of my life when I felt like a failure, he was always there for me with words of encouragement and was proud of me no matter what.

He was the most generous and compassionate man and enjoyed helping people however he could. There was never a holiday or special occasion that passed that my dad didn’t send a card to me, and once Lillie Grace was born, the same with her. If I had a penny

for every card and thoughtful note he's ever given me, I'd be a rich woman.

The last year and a half has been hard to watch him endure. I'm grateful for the time he stayed with us and that I was able to take care of him but I'm most grateful he is no longer suffering. My heart is full knowing in the days just before he left this world that he and my mom were able to reminisce and share a few laughs together. I know we will see him again one day and until then I will cherish countless memories and know that he's keeping watch on us until then.
